In the past year, I have continued in the work to which this presbytery has called me, and the following is a report of my labors since the stated meeting of the presbytery in August 2020.

Service at Reformed Theological Seminary

I have taught a full load of courses in the Spring semester of 2021. I also teach an online course for RTS Global.

I have been consistently involved in advising and counseling seminary students.

RTS granted me a sabbatical from teaching responsibilities from June 1, 2020 through February 1, 2021. This sabbatical has allowed me to complete several writing projects.

As of June 1, 2021, I have a role in donor care at RTS.

Service outside of Reformed Theological Seminary

My family and I attended First Presbyterian Church, Jackson, when I was not preaching elsewhere.

I served as stated supply for Second Presbyterian, Yazoo City, MS in May-July 2021.

I completed writing a commentary on the book of Hosea for Lexham Press.

I am also preparing material from previous presentations for publication as two separate books.

I serve on the steering committee of the Psalms and Hebrew Poetry section of the Evangelical Theological Society. I presented a paper for this section at the annual meeting of ETS in November 2020.

I presently have several works under contract for publication.
